### I.C.E. GRANT UPDATE



Since breaking ground on the ICE Grant project in late April, quite a bit of work has already been completed. All of the required trees, asphalt roadbeds, driveway approaches and sidewalks have been removed and new water mains have been installed throughout the project. Construction of the new sanitary lines are

scheduled to be completed by the end of August. All storm sewer work, which includes the replacement of a box culvert on Rippon Avenue is scheduled to be completed by the middle of September. When all of the underground work is complete, reconstruction of the streets will begin, which will include all new concrete curb and gutter, drive approaches, sidewalk and asphalt paving.
