BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES AWARDS

The City of Hillsdale Board of Public Utilities Water Department has been awarded a Water Fluoridation Quality Award from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Fluoridation is the adjustment of fluoride in drinking water to a level that is effective for preventing tooth decay. The award recognizes those communities that achieved excellence in community water fluoridation by maintaining a consistent level of fluoride in drinking water throughout 2016. For 2016, a total of 1360 public water systems in 29 states received these awards, including 56 in Michigan.

The BPU received national recognition for achieving exceptional electric reliability in 2017 by the American Municipal Power, Inc. "Hillsdale has demonstrated its commitment to reliable electric services. This recognition signifies the Hillsdale Board of Public Utilities' dedication to its customers." DEVELOPMENT CORNER

Street Development Updates:

In 2015, the City Planning Commission decided to make a priority of returning current one-way streets back to two-way as part of the City's Master Plan amendment. This year, in conjunction with the repair work being done to West Street, the Planning Department is working with the Department of Public Services and the City Engineer to present plans to change West Street, between W. Carleton Road. (M-99) and South Street back to two-way traffic. This would also include switching on-street parking from the east side of the street to the west side. Watch for the upcoming public meeting date and time to review and make comments on the preliminary plans.

The 2017 street preservation project for Hillsdale, Lewis and West Fayette Streets will be completed this summer.

Chip seal and fog for North West, South West, River and North Manning Streets will be completed between June and July.

I.C.E. Grant street reconstruction of Garden, Mead, Vine Streets and Rippon Ave will be completed in late October.

Park Development:

Cold Springs Park's refurbished vintage saucer and train playground equipment will be re-installed this summer. Thank you to Leutheuser Buick and Addleman Welding & Sandblasting for donating the refinishing of the play equipment on behalf of the Hillsdale Kiwanis Club.

REMINDERS

Compost Site: The Compost site is open to City residents Tuesday 7am-3pm, Wednesday 12pm - 8pm, Thursday & Friday 7am - 3pm, Saturday 8am-5pm. Closed Sunday & Monday. Brush, leaves, grass/garden clippings will be accepted. ID required.

Property Taxes: Summer taxes are issued July 1st and payable through August 31st without penalty. The Board of Review will meet July 17th for errors found on tax bills. For more information contact the Assessing office at 517-437-6456.

Tall Grass: Pursuant to Section(s) 14.142 – 14.144 of the City of Hillsdale Municipal Code all property owners and/or agents (occupants) of property are responsible for maintaining lawns so that grass and weeds do not exceed a maximum height of 10 inches. This includes the terrace space between the sidewalk and the street.

City Offices Closed : City Offices will close on Monday, May 28th to observe Memorial Day and Wednesday, July 4th to observe Independence Day.
