Meeting Minutes

May 1st, 2013

Gary Stachowicz, Hillsdale City Forester, called the Shade Tree meeting to order at 3:06 P.M.

Board members present:

Approval of minutes:

Before the minutes of the February 6th 2013 meeting were approved, Dr. Bidny raised a question relating to comments made at the last meeting of who would pay the tree value from an illegally cut city tree, the resident who asked a contractor to cut the tree, or the contractor that performed the cutting of the tree. Gary stated that the person who cut and removed the tree was liable. The ordinance states that the person responsible shall pay the value as determined by the City Forester. A motion was made by Keith to have Gary review the wordage of this with the city attorney to see if there needs to be any adjustment in the language as stated. Motion seconded by Dr. Bidny.

A. Welcome new member to the committee: Gary formally welcomed Barb Vallieu to the Shade Tree Committee. Barb replaces B.J. Holton who recently resigned from the committee. Dr. Bidny mentioned sending B.J. a letter of appreciation thanking her for her time spent on the Shade Tree Committee.

- B. **Planting locations for 2013:** Gary said that on Thursday May 2nd, Lodi Farms out of Ann Arbor will be here to plant 41 trees throughout the city. Half the trees will be planted on major streets and the other half on local streets. One tree is a replacement from last years planting.
- C. Tree City USA Awards Seminar: On April 16th 2013, Gary attended the Tree City USA awards seminar in Okemos Michigan. The seminar recognizes those communities in Michigan that demonstrate proper care and maintenance of its urban forest resource. This is the 35thyear in a row that Hillsdale has received this honor. The awards are presented in conjunction with the National Arbor Foundation.
- D. **Arbor Day:** This year, Arbor Day was observed on April 15th. Gary reported that he assisted the Hillsdale Garden Club in giving a tree planting demonstration at Gier Elementary School. The presentation was given to 1st grade students. After the presentation, each student was given a silky dogwood seedling to take home and plant.
- E. On Tuesday April 30th, Gary gave a presentation to a group of local Girl scouts on the benefits trees can have on their community. He also showed the girl scouts how to properly plant and care for a tree.
- F. Tree Canopy analysis: Gary said that the City of Hillsdale received a "free" tree canopy analysis from Davey Tree Co. The analysis shows that the City of Hillsdale has a total land cover area of approximately six square miles and of that, 1.83 miles is covered in tree canopy or 29%.

Adjournment: Motion was made by Barb Vallieu to adjourn the Shade Tree meeting at 3:55 P.M. The motion was seconded by Keith Richard.

City of Hillsdale Cemetery Board Commission Minutes May 1, 2013

I. Call to Order:

Meeting was called to order by Chairman Keith Richard at 4:10 P.M.

II. Board members present:

Keith Richard, Sally Fallon, John Barrett, Vicki Ladd and Carl "Bud" Heinowski Also present: Katy Price- City Admin Assistant.

III. Approval of Minutes:

Barrett made the motion to accept the minutes of the March 4, 2013 meeting; seconded by Fallon. All Ayes, Motion Passed.

IV. Public Comments: None

V. Old Business

- A. Expansion at Oak Grove Richard discussed the need for proposed layout of the graves and roads within this new section. With the approval of seal-coating of all roads planned for both Oak Grove and Lakeview Cemeteries as part of the upcoming fiscal year, this will accelerate the need to complete the placement of the road within the new section. The layout procedure for both the graves and roads, as well as the grading and installation of larger stone as a base and topping it off with crushed concrete, would need to be done in advance of the seal-coating. Richard also stated that topsoil will need to be placed and seeded in conjunction with the road construction. Fallon asked about the wrought fencing discussed at last meeting, and if anyone had a chance to contact the company out of Allen yet. Richard stated he has not contacted them yet, as this item was not approved for the upcoming fiscal year.
- B. New Columbarium Bids have been advertised for the proposed 84 Niche Columbarium to be placed at the Lakeview Cemetery. These bids were advertised in the Hillsdale Daily Newspaper and posted on the City website. They are due back in the Clerk's office Monday, May 13, 2013 at 10:00 AM. Richard proposed that the columbarium be placed on the north portion of the oval shaped 'rotunda' of the street named "Crescent" in the 1937 Plat of Lakeview Cemetery. \$16,250.00 has been budgeted for the unit in the current fiscal year. Lakeview's Columbarium will be very similar to the one at Oak Grove cemetery, but a bit shorter.

- C. Delinquent graves— Katy Price discussed that City Manager Brown is working with the City Attorney on what to do with the 2 people with outstanding delinquent graves that have no current addresses.
- D. Update Regarding Notification Process for Scheduling Funerals— Richard updated the board stating there have been no more scheduling conflicts with phone calls or other items. Richard stated that Sexton, Eugene Goodlock revised his voice message so that callers will know they must speak with the main office at DPS to schedule a funeral.
- E. Updates on 2013-14 Budget Requests/ Approvals- The overall opinion of the Cemetery Board at the last meeting was that their top priority for capital improvement needs were the roads at both cemeteries. Richard reported this request was in-fact approved by City Council for the upcoming fiscal year. Richard discussed the chip seal process and the need for DPS crews to perform some work to delineate and 'crisp up' the edge of the streets prior to the chip seal installation. There is \$45,000 designated in the budget for the chip-seal project.

VI. New Business

- A. Appointment for the Cemetery Board— Richard is the board member with term expiring this year. Richard has been a part of the board since 2001, but wasn't appointed until May 2012. Richard inquired as to if the board would like to appoint a new chair. Discussion ensued, but all agreed Richard should continue to chair. The Mayor has been notified and will discuss whether Richard is to be reappointed at the next O&G and Council meeting.
- B. Enforcement of Rule regarding pets on Cemetery Property— Richard discussed the fact that many persons who visit both cemeteries allow their dogs to run loose. The cemetery rules are posted on a sign at the entrance to both cemeteries which clearly state the dogs need to be on a six foot leash, and owners need to pick up after them. Richard suggested that the board could purchase a 'Mutt & Mitt' station and post it at the entrance to the cemeteries for use. It was suggested that persons observing this violation can call the police for enforcement. Fallon asked if one cemetery was worse than the other. It was unclear to say which cemetery was worse.

Fallon stated the Eugene has been extremely good in making the cemeteries look beautiful. She appreciates the hard work he does on the clock and off. Richard stated that Eugene takes ownership of the cemeteries and does a great job, as do other city employees.

Barrett thanked Richard for the Cemetery Bylaws and Rules & Regulations that were included in the agenda and packet.

VII. Adjournment

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Minutes of Operations and Governance Committee May 14, 2013

The O & G (Operations and Governance) Committee met on Tuesday May 14, 2013 in the 2nd Floor Conference Room, City Hall. Present were: Mayor Doug Moon, Committee Members Brian Watkins, Mary Wolfram, and Ruth Brown; and City Manager Linda Brown.

The main purpose of this meeting was for committee members to bring sample copies of city manager performance evaluation forms to review in an effort to improve the form the City of Hillsdale is currently using to make the questions on our form more specific to the City Manager's position. The committee spent approximately 35 minutes reviewing and discussing the various forms that committee members had collected.

Brian presented a copy of the City of Georgetown, Texas City Manager Performance Evaluation (September 2011) and stated that one of the reasons that he liked this form was that it included a section for the City Manager to fill out as self-evaluation. Previously, Brian had found the ICMA (International City Manager's Association) City Manager Evaluation on the Internet, however, upon further review, stated that he really didn't like that form because the questions were too vague, too shallow, and didn't dig deep enough. Brian also had one "Leadership."

Ruth presented the Village Manager Evaluation form from the Village of Jonesville. She stated that Dave Steele had written the form based on information he gleaned from an MML seminar he attended about City Manager performance review/evaluation forms.

Mary presented a Sample Village Manager Evaluation from Cassopolis, a City Manager Evaluation from Sault Ste. Marie, and a City Manager Evaluation from Lapeer.

Discussion ensued. In referencing the Georgetown form, Mayor Moon asked how you would compile the key (1-Always, 2-Almost Always, etc.) into a grade. Brian suggested kicking out the highest and the lowest scores and averaging the rest. Mayor Moon stated that he did not use that method on Linda's current evaluation, however, the committee agreed that was OK. Mayor Moon stated that the only thing he didn't like about the Georgetown form was that the key on the form was inverted.

Mary asked about an opportunity for employees to offer their input. Mayor Moon pointed out that on the Georgetown form there is a section for "City Staff Form" where city staff fill out an evaluation section.

Ruth asked for a copy of the form that the City of Hillsdale is currently using, however, one was not available. Brian said that it is similiar to the ICMA form. Ruth said that on the Lapeer form, she liked the section at the top that stated the purpose of the performance evaluation and she liked at the end where it said, "New performance goals and objectives" which would be something definitive going forward that would come out of the evaluation.

On the "Leadership" form, Brian stated that he liked the questions because they were deeper. Mary said that the ratings should be numbers, instead of letters, and that it should be an odd number of categories. She liked the sections for comments.

The issue of confidentialty was discussed. Brian suggested sending the form on e-mail because this would eliminate handwriting in the comments section, where, if the form was written, the tabulator might be able to tell by the handwriting who wrote the comments. Brian suggested the forms be anonymous.

Mary emphasized confidentialty and comments and also suggested that the comments and ratings sections be separated when compiling results. Mary said that we would lose alot by not actually reading the comments. Brian asked for constructive comments.

The length of time given to complete the form and the place where the form would be filled out was also discussed. Mary and Ruth agreed that they would like some time to think about the questions and answers before completing the form. Mayor Moon did a demonstration on the white board.

The committee concluded this discussion deciding to work on the forms individually by indicating things you like, don't like, things you would add, etc., and to have your results ready for further discussion at a future O & G meeting date TBA.

Linda stated she had looked into the issue of when we could put the appointed clerk question back on the ballot again and found out that it is February 2014, not November 2013.

Mayor Moon discussed Linda's current evaluation for fiscal year ending June 30, 2012. He suggested the results be discussed in a closed session at the next Council meeting.

ORDINANCE # 2013-

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTIONS 28-32, 28-34, 28-42, AND 28-44 OF ARTICLE II OF CHAPTER 28 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF HILLSDALE REGARDING COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL OF SOLID WASTE AND YARD RUBBISH

THE CITY OF HILLSDALE ORDAINS THAT:

Sections 28-32, 28-34, 28-42, and 28-44, of Article II of Chapter 28 of the Code of the City of Hillsdale are hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 28-32. Accumulation of solid waste prohibited.

All exterior property and premises, and the interior of every structure, shall be free from any accumulation of solid waste and yard rubbish.

Sec. 28-34. Rules and regulations by city manager.

The solid waste and yard rubbish collection service of the city shall be under the supervision and direction of the director. The city manager shall make such reasonable rules and regulations concerning the collection of solid waste and yard rubbish as the city manager shall deem proper, subject to approval of the council. No person shall fail to observe any such rule or regulation so adopted and approved. Upon order of the city manager, the solid waste or yard rubbish collection service may be discontinued to any premises where the occupant fails or refuses to comply with the provisions of this chapter or any rule or regulation adopted pursuant hereto, and such service need not thereafter be reinstituted until such violation is remedied to the satisfaction of the director.

Sec. 28-42. Littering; maintenance of property by owner or occupant.

- A. No owner or occupant of any property shall deposit, place, allow, suffer, or otherwise permit the deposit or placement of any solid waste or yard rubbish upon or into any adjacent part of any street, alley, or other property, public or private, except in accordance with the collection of solid waste and yard rubbish throughout the city pursuant to the city's collection system and the provisions of this ordinance.
- B. No owner or occupant of any property shall deposit, place, allow, suffer, or otherwise permit the storage or accumulation of solid waste or yard rubbish upon such premises, unless stored or accumulated in as permitted by this article.

Sec. 28-44 Penalties.

Any person who shall violate any provision of this ordinance shall, upon a finding of responsibility, be chargeable with and responsible for a municipal civil infraction.

Except as specifically amended herein, all remaining provisions of Chapter 28 of the Code of the City of Hillsdale shall remain in full force and effect.

This ordinance and/or a summary of its regulatory effect and its effective date shall be published within fifteen (15) days from the date of its passage as required by law.

Subject to said publication having occurred as above provided, this ordinance shall become effective fifteen (15) days from the date of its passage.

New Business B – Award of Contract for Roofing DPS Building

BACKGROUND:

Bids were recently solicited to install new roofing at the Department of Public Services building on Waterworks Drive. I have enclosed the completed Standard Bid Information Form which has been completed by DPS staff. As you can see, three (3) bids were submitted with the low bidder being McDonald Roofing from Jackson, Michigan at a cost of \$54,622.00.

As you know, Council's policy with regard to local bidders allows the bid to be three (3%) per cent higher than the low bid. The policy also allows for a variance for sealed bids to be determined on a case-by-case basis for all bids over \$30,000.00. In this case, three (3%) per cent more would be \$1,860.00, however, the local bid was \$7,378.00 higher than the lowest bid which is thirteen and one-half (13.5%) per cent.

I have also included a memo from DPS Director Keith Richard for your review.

RECOMMENDATION:

I recommend Council accept the low bid of \$54,622.00 from McDonald Roofing and authorize the Mayor and Clerk's signatures on the enclosed contract.

Please find attached my recommendation for award of the bid to install new roofing at the DPS Building for inclusion in next Mondays City Council meeting agenda. I have also attached the bid tabulation sheet as well for your review. You will note the bid results indicate that of the three bidders the only local bidder, Bramman Roofing, submitted the highest bid coming in \$7378 higher than the low bidder, McDonald Roofing of Jackson. This was a surprise, as I understand that McDonald uses union labor, which we all have seen typically pays at a higher wage scale. The second lowest bidder, Sherriff- Goslin Co., of Battle Creek submitted a bid that was \$7278 higher than the low bid. I have consulted with the manufactures supplier of the roofing materials specified for this project, Firestone Roofing, and they have confirmed that all three firms that bid this job are certified installers of their product and are capable of supplying a finish product that is warrantable.

Therefore, my recommendation. There is \$60,000 budgeted in the current fiscal year for this project.

<u>Preamble</u>

The City of Hillsdale, Michigan, a Michigan municipal corporation, (Hillsdale), is the owner of real property located at 149 Waterworks Ave in the City of Hillsdale which is commonly known as the "Department of Public Services". Hillsdale has solicited and received sealed, competitive bids from licensed contractors who provide roof repair and replacement (Roofing) services on a commercial basis, which services include, but are not limited to the removal and proper disposal of existing roofing materials, the performance of needed repairs, and the provision and installation of new roofing materials. As a result of said solicitation McDonald Roofing of 3960 Ann Arbor Rd Jackson, MI 49202 (the Contractor) has submitted and been awarded a contract to perform such services in accordance with the terms and provisions of the bid specifications contained therein and this agreement.

A. General Terms

- (1) In consideration of the payments to be made to the Contractor pursuant to this contract, Contractor agrees to and shall provide Roofing services to Hillsdale, as hereinafter identified and provided.
- (2) Contractor shall provide to Hillsdale, in addition to actual removal and installation services, all labor, new roofing materials, supplies and services as are necessary to provide and complete the services described in the attached Advertisement for Bids and Description of Project and Project Specifications, and as contemplated by this agreement, all of which shall be provided and maintained at Contractor's sole expense.

In the event the Contractor fails to make such repair and/or restoration, Hillsdale may perform such repair and/or restoration and the cost thereof shall be invoiced to the Contractor or deducted from the payment due under this contract to the Contractor.
- (5) Contractor shall be responsible for obtaining all necessary permits and licenses at the Contractor's sole expense, and to fully comply with all applicable statutes, ordinance, rule and regulations.
- (6) Work shall commence not later than fourteen (14) calendar days from the date of execution of this contract and shall be completed within ten (10) days after starting unless Hillsdale grants an extension of time to complete the work in writing.

B. Qualifications

including but not limited to the removal and proper disposal of existing roofing material, the performance of needed roof repairs, and the provision and installation of new roofing materials through the present time. Contractor further represents that it possesses the skill, experience, competence and financial ability to carry out and fulfill all of its duties and obligations under this contract in a timely and workmanlike manner.

- (2) Contractor further represents and covenants that it shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment with respect to hiring, tenure, terms, conditions, or privileges of employment, or any matter directly or indirectly related to employment, because of race, color, religion, national origin, age, height, weight, marital status or other legally protected status. It is understood and agreed by and between the parties that breach of this covenant may be regarded as a material breach of this contract.

(1) Hillsdale agrees to and shall pay Contractor for its services under this contract, subject to and dependent on the Contractor's compliance with and fulfillment of all of its covenants and promises to Hillsdale hereunder, the total contract price of Fifty-four Thousand Six Hundred Twenty-two (\$54,622.00) Dollars, which the parties agree includes all Michigan sales and use taxes currently imposed by legislative enactment and as

administered by the Michigan Department of Revenue.

E. <u>Independent Contractor</u>

- (1) It is further agreed and acknowledged by the parties that Contractor is an independent contractor and that neither it nor any of its employees, agents, servants or representatives are employees of Hillsdale.
- (2) It is further agreed that Contractor is solely responsible for the management, direction, scheduling, oversight, discipline, training and compensation of its employees and the work they perform, as well as for the provision of all tools, equipment and supplies required to fulfill Contractor's obligations under this contract.

F. Entire Agreement

- (1) This contract, together with the bid specifications and bidding instructions, and bid submitted by Contractor, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes and merges all prior representations into its terms.
- (2) The parties acknowledge that there are no other representations, inducements, promises or agreements between them, whether oral or written.
- (3) In case of conflict between this contract and the bid specifications, bidding instructions and/or the Roofing services bid submitted by the Contractor or any other claimed agreement, representation, inducement, promise or agreement, the terms and provisions of this contract shall control and be binding upon the parties.
- (4) Contractor acknowledges and agrees that all documents that it has provided or hereafter provides to Hillsdale in connection with or regarding its bid, this contract, its performance and compensation are subject to disclosure under the Freedom of Information Act and Contractor hereby expressly consents to the City's reproduction and release of such documents, in whole or in part, in response to a Freedom of Information Act request.

G. Termination

- (1) Hillsdale may terminate this contract without further obligation or liability to Contractor at its option and without prejudice to any other remedies to which it might be entitled, whether in law, in equity, under this contract, or otherwise, by giving written notice of termination to Contractor if the latter should:
 - (a) be adjudged bankrupt;
 - (b) become insolvent or have a receiver of its assets appointed;
 - (c) make a general assignment for the benefit of creditors;
 - (d) default in the performance of any obligation under this contract;
 - (e) breach any covenant under this contract;
 - (f) institute or suffer to be instituted any procedures for reorganization of its affairs;
 - (g) fail to perform any of its obligations to Hillsdale under this contract to Hillsdale's satisfaction.

Notice of termination pursuant to the forgoing provisions shall be provided to Contractor in writing and shall be delivered by ordinary first class mail or personal service.

If Contractor fails to complete this contract within the specified time or due to any of the reasons listed above and Hillsdale terminates the contract and retains a new contractor to complete the work that this contract contemplates, Contractor shall be liable to and shall reimburse Hillsdale for the difference in the price between the newly acquired contractor's bid price and the Contractor bid price.






