

City Manager Brown requested the City Attorney consider the matter and render an opinion regarding the Airport Manager or Hillsdale Aero's ability to conduct such an event without the City's authorization. City Manager Brown presented Council with the prepared opinion for review. The opinion addresses several concerns raised in connection with the event; one of the most significant being the potential exposure for liability as it appears the City would not be protected under governmental immunity as the event is not a governmental function. Another concern was in regard to a concern that if one non-profit is allowed to conduct a fundraising event at the site, the City would need to make

that same opportunity available to all non-profits, regardless of what their cause is. Mr. Sheibner provided material explaining the details of the event and its participants.

Council members expressed their appreciation for the event, but also their concerns. City Attorney Loren gave an explanation of the concerns surrounding the event and stated there are ways to work some of this out. Mr. Loren suggested Council recommend the matter to the Community Development Committee for discussion with legal representatives present. Mr. Loren recommended the Council give the CDC power to act in order to help move the possible approval of the proposed event along.

Grossroads representatives approached Council with background information regarding their non-profit organization and the benefit this fundraiser would have to offer area youth.

D. Overnight Parking

Council previously authorized a trial period for overnight parking by permit in Lot J (behind the post office) for residents of downtown apartments. There were only a few individuals who used the permit and for the most part, there were no problems associated with their use. Accordingly, I am recommending that the overnight parking be approved again utilizing the same forms and rules as well as permit documents. This opportunity is, of course, only applicable to Lot J.

E. HBA Use Agreement

The Hillsdale Business Association has requested use of certain streets to conduct activities in connection with its annual sidewalk sales. The event is proposed for July 19 and July 20 this year. I have attached an Agreement setting forth the details of the event and obligations of the parties.

I recommend that Council approve the attached Agreement and authorize signatures by the Mayor and Clerk, subject to final legal review.

AGREEMENT FOR USE PORTION OF STREET

This Agreement is made and entered between the City of Hillsdale, a Michigan municipal corporation, of Hillsdale, Michigan (Hillsdale) and Hillsdale Business Association, a not-for-profit, 501(C)3 Michigan corporation, P.O. Box 98, Hillsdale, Michigan 49242.

Preamble

Hillsdale controls the usage of local streets within its jurisdiction. Among other governmental functions, Hillsdale seeks to promote the use of its streets for the use and benefit of its citizens and the general public.

At various times, functions are proposed that involve the use of a portion of a public street to which Hillsdale's citizens, as well as the public at large, are invited and encouraged to attend. In such instances, when Hillsdale determines that the proposed activity will inure to the economic, cultural and general benefit of its citizens and of the community at large, it has endeavored to cooperate with the activity's sponsor/promoter. In doing so, Hillsdale is concerned with regulating the use of its streets so as to reasonably assure that they are not used in a manner that exposes persons attending activities as are allowed to take place in or on any portion of its public streets to unreasonable risks of harm, as well as to assure that no damage is done to its street facilities.

Hillsdale Business Association desires to sponsor and promote an event to which the general public is invited that will provide bands, sidewalk sales, food and drink concessions as well as other activities. The event is proposed to take place on Howell St. from Bacon St. to North St. and McCollum St. from Broad St. to the Mid-town alley beginning at 7:00 AM on July 19, 2013 and ending at or before 6:00 PM on July 20, 2013; North Street from Howell Street to the Mid-town alley, Bacon Street from Howell Street to the Mid-town alley and the Mid-town alley between Waldron St. and Bacon St. beginning at 2:00 PM and ending at or before 10:30 PM on July 19, 2013; Howell St. from just north of CNB drive-through exit to Bacon Street beginning at 5:00 PM and ending at or before 10:30 PM on July 19, 2013.

Hillsdale Business Association has represented that it is a responsible organization and that it has created appropriate regulations and policies by which it will regulate participants in the event it proposes to promote and sponsor. Hillsdale Business Association also represents that participation in its event is and will be open to all on a nondiscriminatory basis.

Hillsdale has determined that it is in its best interests and the interests of the general public to allow Hillsdale Business Association to use the described portions of Howell Street, East Bacon Street, McCollum Street, North Street and the Mid-town Alley as the site from which it may conduct its proposed event, and Hillsdale Business Association has agreed to do so, all in accordance with the following terms and conditions.

Agreement

1. In consideration of and reliance on Hillsdale Business Association's promises and its full compliance with all of the terms and conditions contained in this agreement, Hillsdale agrees to allow Hillsdale Business Association to use the following portions of its streets during specified periods on July 19 and July 20, 2013 for the purpose of preparing for

and conducting its proposed event and related activities for the use, benefit and enjoyment of the general public during the stated hours and thereafter to restore said streets to a condition fit for public travel that is at least as good as when taken, all as hereinafter provided:

a. Howell St. from Bacon St. to North St. and McCollum St. from Broad St. to the Mid-town alley beginning at 7:00 AM on July 19 ending at or before 6:00 PM on July 20, 2013; North St. from Howell St. to the Mid-town alley, Bacon St. from Howell to the Mid-town alley and the Mid-town alley between Waldron St. and Bacon St. beginning at 2:00 PM and ending at or before 10:30 PM on July 19, 2013; Howell St. from just north of CNB drive-through exit to Bacon Street beginning at 5:00 PM and ending at or before 10:30 PM on July 19, 2013.

The street closures identified above will be accomplished pursuant to Traffic Control Order issued by the Director of Public Safety.

- 2. Hillsdale Business Association agrees to and shall be solely responsible for obtaining, posting and paying the fees for all applicable and necessary permits, including but not limited to those that might be required by the health department, the posting of signs, as well as any rule, regulations and requirements that might be required by any state, county or local statute, ordinance, rule or regulation.
- 3. Hillsdale Business Association further agrees that it shall be solely responsible for obtaining, arranging for and providing all staff, equipment, tents, signs, tables, chairs, port-a-johns, roll-offs, food, beverages, provisions, supplies, goods, entertainment, concessions and other facilities as it or an applicable governmental agency determines necessary to provide for and to the general public in connection with its proposed event, all at its sole expense.
- 4. Hillsdale Business Association agrees that immediately following the end of the event and at its sole expense, it shall promptly remove or cause the removal all equipment, tents, signs, tables, chairs port-a-johns, roll-offs, trash, litter and other items from Howell Street, East Bacon Street, McCollum Street, North Street and the Mid-town Alley. Hillsdale Business Association shall notify the Hillsdale City Police and secure its permission to open the street to vehicular traffic before removing the barricades Hillsdale's Police Department placed to block the described portions of Howell Street, East Bacon Street, McCollum Street, North Street and the Mid-town Alley from the public's vehicular use. Hillsdale's barricades, when removed, shall be placed out of the main traveled portion of the street adjacent to the curbs for pick up by Hillsdale.
- 5. Hillsdale Business Association further agrees that the restoration of the entire area occupied or used by it to a swept and tidy condition shall be completed not later than 6:00 PM on Saturday, July 20, 2013.
- 6. Hillsdale Business Association agrees to abide by all applicable statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations pertaining to it and to all provisions of this agreement during its occupancy and use of the described portions of Howell Street, East Bacon Street, McCollum Street, North Street and the Mid-town Alley.

- 7. Hillsdale Business Association acknowledges that there are no public restroom facilities at the site during the time of the scheduled event. Accordingly, Hillsdale Business Association represents and agrees that, at its sole expense and as a condition precedent to the commencement of its event, it will provide and have in place portable restroom facilities that comply with all applicable health and sanitation codes for its scheduled event in full working order and sufficient quantity to accommodate the needs of its participants and the general public.
- 8. Hillsdale Business Association agrees that no attachments for tents or any other facilities will be made to any paved surfaces within any portion of the Howell Street, East Bacon Street, McCollum Street, North Street or the Mid-town Alley rights of way that would cause holes or other damage to the pavement without the prior written consent of the Director of Hillsdale's Department of Public Streets.
- 9. Hillsdale Business Association agrees that it shall not permit any street other than the described portions of Howell Street, East Bacon Street, McCollum Street North Street or the Mid-town Alley to be blocked or obstructed. Further, Hillsdale Business Association agrees to and shall confine its proposed event activities solely to the described portions of Howell Street, East Bacon Street, McCollum Street North Street or the Mid-town Alley.
- 10. Hillsdale Business Association agrees and understands that it, at its sole expense, is and shall be solely responsible for the repair and restoration of all damage to private or public property that results from or because of Hillsdale Business Association's proposed event, whether real or personal, and to leave the premises in a condition equal to or better than existed prior to its use, free from all garbage, trash or other items.
- 11. Hillsdale Business Association represents that it is a valid Michigan not-for-profit, 501(C)3 corporation and further represents that it possesses or will obtain and provide persons with the skill, experience, competence and financial ability to carry out and fulfill all of its duties and obligations under this contract in a timely and professional manner.
- 12. Hillsdale Business Association further represents and covenants that it does not discriminate against any employee, applicant for employment, and shall not discriminate against any general public that will participate in the event it is staging under this agreement or any other member of the public because of race, color, religion, national origin, age, height, weight, marital status or other legally protected class. It is understood and agreed by and between the parties that breach of this covenant may be regarded as a material breach of this agreement.
- 13. Hillsdale Business Association shall provide City with proof of public liability and property damage insurance with coverage that is satisfactory to Hillsdale and limits of liability of not less than a single limit of Five Hundred Thousand and 00/100 (\$500,000.00) Dollars, with City designated therein as a named insured to be and remain in force for the duration of Hillsdale Business Association's presence on and use of Hillsdale's street such proof to be provided at the time of execution of this Agreement.

- 14. Hillsdale Business Association shall carry and provide all workers' compensation insurance coverage at its sole expense for its employees as is required by the laws of the State of Michigan and provide proof thereof to Hillsdale prior to the commencement of any work under this contract, if applicable.
- 15. Hillsdale Business Association represents to Hillsdale that it intends to use the described area for the purpose of providing side-walk sales and a Burger tasting and Bargain event, food, beverages, and other similar activities, and that the consumption or possession of alcoholic beverages within the described area will not be permitted. In reliance on Hillsdale Business Association's representations and its other promises, as contained in this agreement, Hillsdale hereby grants and Hillsdale Business Association hereby accepts the exclusive control over the described portions of Howell Street, East Bacon Street, McCollum Street, North Street and the Mid-town Alley and the activities therein, it being the intention of the parties that Hillsdale Business Association is and shall be solely responsible for maintaining the described areas and regulating all activities therein so as to keep them in reasonably safe condition and free of unreasonable risk of harm, for the use and benefit of the general public and others using or within said area or any of its facilities, products or activities.
- 16. Hillsdale Business Association further agrees to and shall defend, indemnify and hold Hillsdale harmless from any and all damages, claims, demands, causes of action, lawsuits, attorney fees and related expenses, as a result of actual or claimed personal injury, including death, property damage or other damage or loss of any kind or nature which are or are claimed to be a proximate result of:
 - a. The negligence, gross negligence or intentional acts or omissions of Hillsdale Business Association, its agents, servants, employees, guests, vendors, invitees, event participants or event attendees which arise or are claimed to have arisen as a result or because of Hillsdale Business Association's proposed event, its associated activities and events; or
 - b. The negligence, gross negligence or intentional acts or omissions of Hillsdale Business Association, its agents, servants, employees, guests, vendors, invitees, event participants or event attendees in the use of or defects in the areas described in Attachment A, or the equipment, tents, signs, tables, chairs, port-a-johns, and roll-offs or other facilities placed or used by Hillsdale Business Association or any of its agents, servants, employees, guests, vendors, invitees, event participants or event attendees;
 - c. All such damages or injuries, including death, whether caused in part by the negligence of Hillsdale, its employees, agents, servants, or representatives; provided, however, that Hillsdale Business Association shall not be obligated to indemnify Hillsdale for any damages or injuries, including death, caused by or resulting from the sole negligence of Hillsdale.
- 17. Hillsdale Business Association agrees that any and all documents provided to Hillsdale under this agreement are subject to disclosure and hereby expressly consents to Hillsdale's reproduction and release of such documents in response to a request under the Freedom of Information Act.

- 18. Hillsdale Business Association agrees that Hillsdale may immediately terminate this contract without further obligation or liability to Hillsdale Business Association at its option and without prejudice to any other remedies to which it might be entitled, whether in law, in equity or under this contract, by giving written notice of termination to Hillsdale Business Association if the latter should:
 - (a) be adjudged bankrupt;
 - (b) become insolvent or have a receiver of its assets appointed;
 - (c) make a general assignment for the benefit of creditors;
 - (d) default in the performance of any obligation under this contract;
 - (e) breach any covenant under this contract;
 - (f) institute or suffer to be instituted any procedures for reorganization of its affairs;
 - (g) fail to perform any of its obligations to Hillsdale under this contract to Hillsdale's satisfaction.

Provided, however, that Hillsdale Business Association's indemnification, defense, hold harmless and insurance coverage agreements shall survive any such termination.

Notice of termination pursuant to the forgoing provisions shall be provided to Hillsdale Business Association in writing and shall be delivered by ordinary first class mail or personal service to the following person at the following address: Peg Williams, P.O. Box 98, Hillsdale, Michigan 49242.

- 19. All notices from Hillsdale Business Association to Hillsdale shall be in writing and shall be delivered by ordinary first class mail or personal service to the following person at the following address: Linda Brown, Hillsdale City Manager, 97 N. Howell Street, Hillsdale, Michigan 49242.
- 17. The parties agree that there are no other representations, inducements, promises or agreements between them, whether oral or written.
- 18. This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Michigan. Hillsdale and Hillsdale Business Association further agree that in the event of legal action arising from or as a result of this Agreement or its breach, venue and jurisdiction for such action shall be in the Hillsdale County Circuit Court or in the District Court located within the County of Hillsdale, Michigan, whichever has subject matter jurisdiction over any such dispute.

Re: An Ordinance to Amend Article II of Chapter 24 of the Code of the City of Hillsdale by Adding New Sections

BACKGROUND:

At the July 1, 2013 meeting Council set tonight as the date to conduct a public hearing regarding the adoption of the above ordinance. As you will recall, the ordinance modifications were prompted by the revitalization of the Sandy Beach area following the Rotary Club's renovation of the beach house/concession stand.

The proposed ordinance includes language regarding the use of grills, barbeques and campfire, animals, bicycling, skateboarding, roller skating, etc., smoking and the use of tobacco products as well as parking restrictions.

RECOMMENDATION:

I recommend that Council conduct the public hearing following which I request that Council pass the proposed ordinance and order its publication as passed. The ordinance would then become effective fifteen (15) days after passage provided publication has taken place.

ORDINANCE #-_ 3/4/3

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ARTICLE II OF CHAPTER 24 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF HILLSDALE BY ADDING NEW SECTIONS

THE CITY OF HILLSDALE ORDAINS that Article II of Chapter 24 should be and is hereby amended so as to add the following new sections:

Sec. 24-39. Grills, Barbecues, Campfires.

- (a) No person shall start, maintain, or use an outdoor fire in any city park for any purpose whatsoever except as otherwise authorized in this section.
- (b) No person shall start, maintain, or use an outdoor fire in any city park unless placed, maintained, and contained in a grill, barbecue, stove, or other freestanding metal vessel, device, or utensil and used solely for the purpose of cooking, heating, reheating, or otherwise preparing food or drink for consumption.
- (c) Notwithstanding any provision contained in this section to the contrary, no person shall start, maintain, or use an outdoor fire on or within any portion of Sandy Beach Park for any purpose whatsoever, whether or not placed, maintained, and contained in a grill, barbecue, stove, or other freestanding metal vessel, device or utensil.

Sec. 24-40. Animals running at large; leash required.

- (a) No person shall possess, permit or lead any animal, fowl, or reptile, whether leashed or not, in Sandy Beach Park.
- (b) No person shall possess, permit or lead any animal, fowl, or reptile on or in any city park except when leashed; provided, however, that no person shall possess, permit or lead any animal, fowl, or reptile, whether leashed or not, in Sandy Beach Park at any time whatsoever.
- (c) The prohibitions contained in this section, other than leashing requirements, do not apply to or prohibit the use of trained guide dogs, hearing dogs, signal dogs, mobility assistance dogs, seizure or medical alert dogs, psychiatric service dogs, or other dogs trained to provide assistance to persons with disabilities.

Sec. 24-41. Bicycling, Skateboarding, Roller Skating, and/or Roller Blading.

No person shall bicycle, skateboard, roller skate or roller blade on any concrete area within Sandy Beach Park at any time whatsoever.

Sec. 24-42. Smoking and the Use of Tobacco Products in City Parks.

- (a) Definitions. As used in this section:
 - (1) Smoking or smoke means the carrying or use by a person of a lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe or other lighted smoking device.
 - (2) Tobacco product means a preparation of tobacco to be inhaled, chewed, sucked or placed in a person's mouth.
- (b) Smoking and use of tobacco products limited to designated areas in public parks.

- (1) No person shall smoke or use tobacco products on the sand portions of the beach within Sandy Beach Park or in any other area on or within Sandy Beach Park, except in such smoking areas as the city manager, or his or her designee, might designate and identify with posted signs.
- (2) No person shall smoke or use tobacco products in any of the following public parks which are owned or operated by the City of Hillsdale, except in such smoking areas as the city manager, or his or her designee, might be designate and identify with posted signs.
- (3) No person shall dispose of any tobacco products, cigar or cigarette butts, tobacco ash or other tobacco products on or in beach areas or in any area of any city park except in a waste container provided for that purpose.
- (c) Except and unless areas in which smoking and the use of tobacco products may be used are designated and identified with posted signs, smoking and the use of tobacco products in city parks is prohibited.

Sec. 24-43. Parking Restrictions.

No person shall park or permit the parking of a motor vehicle on any road, on any grassy area or in any other area within any city park that is not designed for the parking of motor vehicles or that is otherwise posted and signed as a no parking area.

Sec. 24-44 Violations.

Date Published as Passed:

Effective Date:

- (a) Any person who is convicted of violating section 24-32 of this article is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500.00 and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment for a period of not more than 90 days, or both.
- (b) Any person who is found to have violated sections 24-33 through and including section 24-43 of this article, or any of them, is responsible for a municipal civil infraction and subject to the civil fines set forth in the schedule of civil fines in Section 20-33 of this Code and any other relief that may be imposed by the court. Each act of violation and each day upon which such violation occurs shall constitute a separate violation

Except as hereinbefore specifically amended, Article II of Chapter 24 of the Code of the City of Hillsdale and all sections contained therein are hereby ratified and affirmed.

This ordinance and/or a summary of its regulatory effect, its penalty provisions and its effective date shall be published within fifteen (15) days from the date of its passage as required by law.

Subject to said publication having occurred as above provided, this ordinance shall become effective fifteen (15) days from the date of its passage.

District (Resolution)

BACKGROUND:

As previously explained, the Obsolete Property Rehabilitation Act was passed in 2000 and provides a tax incentive to encourage the redevelopment of obsolete buildings into vibrant commercial and mixed-use projects in that it allows the existing taxable value on a designated facility to be frozen for up to 12 years. By freezing the taxable value, it provides an incentive for the developer to make significant improvements to the building without increasing the property taxes. I have once again included a map of the proposed district for your reference.

As I mentioned at the June 17, 2013 meeting, creating the OPRA is viewed as an incentive when making application for grants under the rental rehab program offered through MSHDA.

RECOMMENDATION:

I recommend that Council adopt the attached Resolution determining that the district meets the requirements of the Public Act, that notice of the public hearing was provided to all owners of property within the proposed district both by mail and newspaper advertisement as well as posting, that residents and taxpayers of the City were given an opportunity to be heard and that Council deems it to be in the best interest of the City to establish the proposed district.

SUBJECT: 2013 Sidewalk Special Assessment

BACKGROUND:

At its July 1, 2013 meeting Council established Special Assessment District 2013-01 for sidewalk improvements along the south side of Lynwood from Howell to Elm Street, Special Assessment District 2013-02 for sidewalk improvements along the east side of N. Manning Street from Carleton to North Street and Special Assessment District 2013-03 for sidewalk improvements along the east and west side of Charles Street between E. Sharp Street and Hallett Street.

A hearing must be held tonight to give opportunity for public input. In addition, following that action, it will be necessary to adopt a Resolution which causes the special assessments to be made and directs the Board of Special Assessors to meet and sets another public hearing for August 5, 2013 for interested persons to be heard regarding the assessments. In addition, the Resolution would set the final public hearing for August 19, 2013 to confirm the assessment roll.

RECOMMENDATION:

I recommend that Council conduct the public hearing to hear comments regarding the project and adopt the resolution.

Whereas, the City Council of the City of Hillsdale have determined special assessment district(s) 2013-01, 2013-02 and 2013-03 by resolution; and

Whereas, a public hearing was held July 15, 2013 in order to hear any objections to the proposed improvements; and

Whereas, the Council has determined improvements to sidewalks along Lynwood Boulevard (2013-01), North Manning Street (2013-02) and Charles Street (2013-03) to be necessary. Each project has been designated by street name by the Director of Public Services.

Now therefore be it resolved, that Council does hereby determine that a portion of these improvements are to be defrayed by special assessment. The assessments will be individually determined by frontage and lot, and equally distributed thereto. The total amount to be defrayed as being \$57,985.75 or 75% of the total cost of the project area, the method of imbursement shall be in 10 installments over a 10 year period at the rate of 6% on the unpaid balance.

Be it further resolved, that the Board of Special Assessors is hereby directed to cause the special assessments to be made, and that the Council and the Board of Special Assessors shall meet at separately convened meetings on Monday, August 5, 2013 at 7:00 p.m. in City Hall council chambers to review said assessments, at which time opportunity shall be given to all persons interested to be heard.

Be it further resolved, that the Council set a public hearing for Monday, August 19, 2013 at 7:00 p.m., for the purpose of confirming the assessment roll.

Agenda Item #10: New Business – A – Purchase of Police Vehicle

BACKGROUND:

Bids were recently solicited for the purchase of a new police patrol vehicle. As you can see from the enclosed bid information form, one local bidder, Ken Stillwell Ford-Mercury, Inc., submitted a bid in the amount of \$26,347.00. As you know, the State of Michigan bid meets all criteria required by our Charter for bidding. The vehicle for which bids were being sought is available for purchase through the State purchasing process at a cost of \$25,699.00 which is approximately 2.5% lower that the bid submitted by Ken Stillwell Ford-Mercury, Inc.

Please refer to Director Gutowski's memo for specific details regarding availability of the vehicle. This vehicle will replace Unit 2-4 which is scheduled to be replaced this year on the replacement schedule.

RECOMMENDATION:

I recommend Council reject bids submitted by Cole Story Ford Lincoln and Signature Ford. While Ken Stillwell Ford-Mercury, Inc. is not the low bidder, I remind you that Council has previously adopted a Local Vendor Bid Preference Policy that allows Council to award a bid to a local vendor provided that bid is within three (3%) per cent of the lowest bid. As mentioned above, Stillwell's bid is approximately 2.5% higher than the State bid which would allow Council to award the bid to Stillwell if they so desire instead of utilizing the State bid.

The budgeted amount for the purchase is \$30,000 and accordingly, either bid would be under the budgeted amount.
