BASED ON THE FACTS PRESENTED IN THE RECORD BEFORE THE ZBA AND ON THE FOREGOING DETERMINATION AND FINDINGS, THE ZBA HEREBY:

Grants the variance as requested.

Note: All of the Zoning Board of Appeal's discussions, determinations and findings must be based on the record before it and undertaken and made in open session.

- c. That the granting of such variance will not adversely affect the purposes or objectives of the future land use plan of the city.
- E. In consideration of all appeals and all proposed variations to this chapter, the Board of Appeals shall, before making any variations from this chapter in a specific case, first determine that the proposed variation will not impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent property, or unreasonably increase the congestion in public streets, or increase the danger of fire or endanger the public safety, or unreasonably diminish or impair established property values within the surrounding area, or in any other respect impair the public health, safety, comfort, morals or welfare of the inhabitants of the city. The concurring vote of four members of the Board of Appeals shall be necessary to reverse any order, requirements, decision, or determination of the Zoning Administrator, or to decide in favor of the applicant any matter upon which it is authorized by this chapter to render a decision, except that a concurring vote of five members of the Board of Appeals is necessary to grant a variance for uses of land permitted in this chapter.

10. Meetings.

- A. Regular meetings. The Appeals Board shall meet at least once each year. Any other meetings of the Appeals Board will be called as needed in response to receipt of a Demand for Appeal. The meeting can be called by the zoning administrator, the chairman of the Appeals Board, or, in the Chair's absence, the Vice-Chair.
- B. Other meetings. Meetings shall be called by delivering meeting notice by first class mail or by personal delivery to members of the Appeals Board at least seven days prior to such meeting (so that members receive the notice prior to the weekend prior to the meeting date). The notice shall state the purpose, time, location of the meeting.
- C. Public. All meetings, hearings, records, and accounts shall be open to the public, and posted in compliance with P.A. 267 of 1976, as amended, (being the Michigan Open Meetings Act). All regular and special meetings, hearings, records and accounts shall be open to the public.
 - a. All public comment on all agenda items should be presented at the beginning of the meeting where provided in the printed agenda. After that point during the meeting, public comment is normally not allowed; however, sometimes the Appeals Board may direct questions to members of the public. Public comment is

- at the beginning of the meeting so the Appeals Board can hear concerns and questions before acting on an issue. Those making public comment are expected to be familiar with the issue and have prepared comments ahead of time. To help the public in preparing for the meeting, any written material shall be made available without cost for members of the public asking for a copy prior to the meeting.
- b. The Chair may limit the amount of time allowed for each person wishing to make public comment at an Appeals Board meeting. The Chair may ask members of the audience to caucus with others sharing similar positions so they may select a single spokesperson. If a single spokesperson is selected, that individual shall be able to make public comment at the Appeals Board meeting without time limit or an extended time limit.

D. Recess

- a. The Chair, or the Appeals Board, after the meeting has been in session for two hours (not including site inspections), shall suspend the Appeals Board's business and evaluate the remaining items on its agenda. The Appeals Board shall then decide to finish that meeting's agenda, may act to continue the meeting on another day (fix the time at which to adjourn), or complete some agenda items and continue the meeting on another day to complete other agenda items or postpone certain agenda items to the next meeting. If applicable such action shall include the time, day, month, date, year, and location the Appeals Board will reconvene. If more than 18 hours will pass before the reconvened Commission, public notice shall be given to comply with P.A. 267 of 1976, as amended, (being the Michigan Open Meeting Act M.C.L. 15.261 et seq.). Upon reconvening, a roll call of attendance shall be the first item of business before proceeding at the same point where they left off, without the addition of additional business.
- E. Quorum. Half the total membership of the Appeals Board, rounded up to the next whole number, shall be the quorum for the transaction of business and the taking of official action for all matters.
- F. When a petitioner fails to appear at a properly scheduled meeting of the Appeals Board, the Chair may entertain a motion from the Appeals board to dismiss the case for want of

prosecution. In the absence of a motion by the Appeals Board, the chair shall rule. In cases which are dismissed for want of prosecution, the petitioner will be furnished written notice of the action by the Secretary. The applicant shall have seven (7) days from the date of the notice of dismissal to apply for reinstatement of the case. In such cases, applicant must file a written request with the Secretary for reinstatement of the case. In such cases, applicant must file a written request with the Secretary for reinstatement. Reinstatement shall be at the discretion of the Chair for good cause shown, and upon payment of a fee set from time to time by the governing body. In all cases reinstated in the above described manner, the case will be docketed and re-advertised in the usual manner prescribed for new cases.

- G. Order of Business, Agenda, The Secretary, or designee, shall prepare an agenda for each meeting and the order of business therein shall be as follows:
 - a. Call to order, roll call, and Pledge of Allegiance
 - b. Election of officers, if necessary
 - c. Public Hearings. The Chairman will declare a hearing open and state its purpose.
 - The Chairman shall summarize, provide copies, or conspicuously post the
 procedure for public hearing as outlined in section 10.C, or 10.G of these
 Rules of Procedure for any members of the public in attendance, or
 provide copies.

ii. Case number

- 1. The Zoning Administrator presents the petitioner's request, his action on the matter and reasons for his decisions plus a written copy of the petitioner's request.
- The Petitioner through himself, his agent, his lawyer may
 present his case, including presenting witnesses on his behalf. No
 time limit will be imposed on the petitioner.
- 3. Members of the Appeals Board shall report on their site inspection and any conversations with the petitioner they may have had.
- 4. Members of the public who support the petitioner speak and correspondence is read. At the chairman's option he may:

- a. Recess the meeting for a short time to allow those in support to caucus in order to have one speak on their behalf for an unlimited period of time if there are a large number of people present on an issue or for a set duration of time.
- b. Allow many to speak in favor of the petitioner and can impose a time limit for the speaker that is three minutes or more per speaker.
- 5. Members of the public who oppose the petitioner speak and correspondence is read. At the chairman's option he may:
 - a. Recess the meeting for a short time to allow those in opposition to caucus in order to have one speak on their behalf for an unlimited period of time if there are a large number of people present on an issue.
 - b. Allow many to speak in opposition of the petitioner and can impose a time limit for the speaker that is three minutes or more per speaker.
- 6. Rebuttal. Anyone may ask the Chairman questions on presentations or speeches given at this hearing. The Chairman will seek an answer to the question. Answers shall be given to the Chairman. No discussion, questioning or answering shall take place between any two or more people except between the Chairman and the individual who has the floor.
- 7. Close the hearing. (At this point all public participation on the issue ends)
- d. Public Comment for items on this agenda but which are not items subject to a hearing at this meeting
- e. Recess to another night as provided in section 10.H in these Rules and Procedure (optional)
- f. Housekeeping Business
 - i. Approval of minutes from previous meeting

ARTICLE IX. - OBSCURING WALLS AND FENCES[10]

Footnotes:

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Editor's note—Ord. No. 2014-3, adopted July 21, 2014, in effect repealed the former article IX, §§ 36-681—36-685, and enacted a new § 36-681 as set out herein. The former article IX pertained to similar subject matter and derived from the Code of 1979, §§ 17.40.010—17.40.050.

Sec. 36-681. - Requirements.

All fences, walls, and landscape berms of any nature, type or description located in the City of Hillsdale must conform to the following regulations:

- (1) Approval required. The erection, construction or alteration of any fence, wall or other type of protective barrier must be approved by the zoning administrator (or designee) as to conformance with the requirements of the zoning district and this section.
- (2) General fence, wall, and landscape berm standards.
 - a. Fence wall, or landscape berm height measurement. The height of a fence, wall, or landscape berm will be measured using the following method:
 - The permitted height of all fences, walls, and landscape berms will be measured from the finished grade adjacent to the fence, wall, or berm, as determined by the zoning administrator (or designee).
 - 2. Where elevations differ by more than four feet within ten feet of side or rear lot lines, the zoning administrator (or designee) may allow additional fence, wall, or landscape berm height for the property as measured from the lower elevation.
 - 3. The permitted height of fences or walls will not be measured from any part of a berm or any area of the ground that has been built-up or constructed in a manner that would have the effect of allowing a taller fence than permitted by this chapter.
 - 4. Fencing materials must be all weather and zero maintenance. Treated wood must meet the American Wood Protection Association's UC4B standard for ground contact (heavy duty).
 - b. Masonry walls. Masonry walls must be constructed of the same or complementary building material to that of the principal structure and must be un-pierced (except for pedestrian and vehicular connections) and have a decorative cap. Cement or slag blocks will not be permitted.
 - Visibility at intersections. All fences in the front yards must comply with the requirements of this article, visibility at intersections.
 - d. Decorative fences, walls and landscape berms. Fences, walls, and landscape berms which are two and one-half feet or less in height are considered decorative and do not require a permit.
 - e. Landscape berms. Where provided, landscape berms must conform to the following standards.
 - Berms must comply with the height restrictions for fences and walls in subsections (3) and (4) of
 this section, but in no case may they be maintained at a continuous height. All berms must be
 undulating and include gaps where deemed necessary.
 - 2. Sides of the berm must be constructed with slopes no steeper than one foot vertical for each three feet horizontal.
 - In measuring slope and height, grade elevation will be the average grade elevation adjacent to the proposed berm.
 - Side slopes must be protected from erosion by sod, seed or other living ground cover. If slopes are seeded, they must be protected until the seed germinates and a permanent lawn is established.

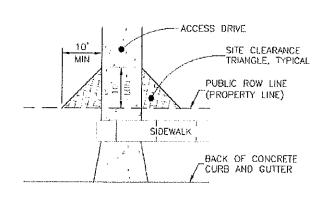

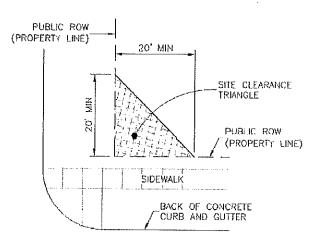
- (3) Fences and walls in the residential districts and manufactured housing communities.
 - a. Ornamental fences and walls located in the required and addressed front yard meeting the definition of a non-privacy fence and not intended to restrain animals of any kind may be up to three feet six inches in height, unless otherwise approved by the zoning administrator (or designee), and must be set back at least one foot from the sidewalk/right-of-way line.
 - b. All fences or walls must be ornamental in nature and should be made of wrought iron, treated or rot resistant wood, brick, stone and similar replications of these materials. However, when abutting residentially zoned and/or used property, and when used to screen parking or outdoor storage areas, the fence must be constructed of an opaque weatherproof material, woven chain link fencing is not permitted.
 - c. Fences and walls located in the required and non-addressed (secondary) front yard of a corner or double frontage lot must be setback from the property line as follows, unless otherwise approved by the zoning administrator (or designee):
 - 1. No less than one foot for ornamental fences and walls meeting the definition of a non-privacy fence and not intended to restrain animals of any kind up to three feet six inches in height;
 - 2. No less than four feet for fences and walls up to four feet in height.
 - 3. No less than six feet for fences and walls up to six feet in height.
 - d. Fences and walls located in the side and rear yards may have a maximum height of six feet, unless otherwise approved by the zoning administrator (or designee), and may be located on the property line assuming the front yard fencing requirements are satisfied.
 - e. Residents are encouraged to utilize ornamental materials, including but not limited to materials such as wrought iron, brick, stone, treated wood and similar replications of these materials, such as vinyl fencing that has the appearance of one of these materials.
 - f. Chain link or similar fencing is permitted everywhere except within the front yard.
 - g. The finished side of a fence or wall must face outward toward any adjacent property or right-of-way.

- h. No fences or walls are permitted within the required site clearance triangles. The same site clearance triangle applies to solid fences abutting detached garages located on the non-addressed frontage of a corner lot, visibility at intersections.
- (4) Fences and walls in commercial and industrial districts.
 - No fence or wall may exceed eight feet in height, unless otherwise approved by the zoning administrator (or designee).
 - b. Fences located in the required non-addressed (secondary) front yard of a corner or double frontage lot, must be set back from the property line, unless otherwise approved by the zoning administrator (or designee), as follows:
 - No less than one foot for ornamental fences and walls meeting the definition of a non-privacy fence and not intended to restrain animals of any kind up to three feet six inches in height;
 - 2. No less than four feet for fences up to four feet in height;
 - 3. No less than six feet for fences up to six feet in height; and
 - 4. No less than eight feet for fences up to eight feet in height.
 - c. All fences or walls must be ornamental in nature and should be made of wrought iron, treated or rot resistant wood, brick, stone and similar replications of these materials. However, when abutting residentially zoned and/or used property, and when used to screen parking or outdoor storage areas, the fence must be constructed of an opaque weatherproof material, woven chain link fencing is not permitted.
 - d. Chain link or similar fencing is permitted everywhere except within the front yard and when abutting residentially zoned and/or used property.
 - e. No fences or walls are permitted within the required site clearance triangles, visibility at intersections.
- (5) Temporary protective fencing associated with construction projects. During construction, protective fencing must be placed around existing vegetation proposed for preservation and other site elements which cannot be easily removed or stored.
 - a. Proposed protective fencing must be clearly identified on the landscape plan.
 - b. Protective fencing cannot be located closer than one foot outside the perimeter of the following, as identified on the landscape plan:
 - 1. The drip lines of existing trees and shrubs; and
 - Planting beds and other site element.
- (6) Prohibited fences. The following fences are prohibited:
 - A fence consisting in whole or part of coils of barbed wire, concertina wire or razor wire;
 - A fence with razor edges, broken glass, affixed spikes, projecting nails or other pointed instruments
 of any kind or description attached; fence gates cannot be constructed so as to create a hazard to the
 public by the projection of any pointed instrument or member when open or partially open;
 - A fence charged or connected with an electrical current, provided however, this provision cannot be construed to apply to electrical fences installed below ground as elements of an animal control or security system;
 - d. A standard barbed wire fence except upon essential service sites or industrial properties which do not abut property zoned or used for residential purposes; in such locations, standard barbed wire may be installed on the top of a fence on arms or cradles extending inward over the owner's property provided that the fence has a minimum height of six feet above the adjacent grade and the combined height of the fence and barbed wire and arms does not exceed eight feet above the adjacent grade;
 - e. A fence which consists in whole or part of woven plastic or other similar materials utilized within a chain link fence; and
 - f. A fence with all metal opaque paneling (e.g., barn siding, roof material, etc.) unless it is part of a conditional use permit.

- g. Concrete barrier units such as are used on construction sites or highways to restrict traffic flow.
- (7) Visibility at intersections.
 - a. When a driveway intersects a public right-of-way or when the subject property abuts the intersection of public rights-of-way, all fences, walls, berms, hedges, screens, structures, plantings or other landscaping within the site clearance triangle areas described below must permit unobstructed cross-visibility. Shrubs and groundcovers located in a site clearance triangle may not be permitted to grow to a height of more than two and one-half feet above the grade at the edge of the pavement. Portions of required berms located within sight clearance triangle cannot exceed a height of two and one-half feet above the pavement grade at the edge of the pavement. Canopy trees may be maintained in this area provided that all branches are trimmed to maintain a clear vision for a vertical height of ten feet above the roadway surface. Sec. 36-84. - Appeal procedure.

(a)An appeal may be taken to the board of appeals by any person, firm or corporation, or any officer, department, board or bureau affected by a decision of the building inspector. Such appeal shall be taken within such time as shall be prescribed by the board of appeals, by general rule, by filing with the building inspector and with the board of appeals a notice of appeal, specifying the grounds thereof. The building inspector shall forthwith transmit to the board of appeals all of the papers constituting the record upon which the action appealed from was taken.

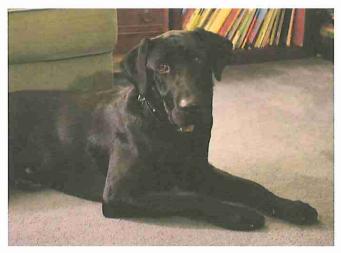
First, I would like to introduce you to Gus. Here he is:

Very cute, no? You should have seen him back when

he was just a little puppy:

Gus is a very good boy. But if he looks a bit sad in these pictures, that is because he really loves to run around outside. Unfortunately, we don't have a fence in our backyard to contain him.





We tried to have Watkins Fence build a 6-ft high wooden fence around our back and side yards for two purposes: (1) to contain Gus, and (2) to give us a bit more privacy. (Right now, anyone walking or driving along the road can see directly into our backyard). Our permit was denied for some unusual reasons, having to do with the nature of our property. Our address is 11 Elm Hill, but our front door and driveway face Charles Street. It's a bit strange that our next-door neighbor has a Charles St. address but we don't. Whatever. Anyway, we were told that technically, since our address is on Elm Hill, all of that street is considered our "front yard," so we'd be limited to a 4-ft high fence.

Here's what it looks like from an aerial view:



So, the ordinance which was used to deny our fence request doesn't seem to apply here, as it calls for front yards to have only 4-ft. fences, and that part of Elm Hill where we're planning to build the fence is clearly not our front yard, but a side yard.

Also, if the rules for fence height are due to concerns about visibility for cars around corners, such issues don't seem to apply in this case, since the side yard is fully away from the curve of the road. The fence won't affect drivers' visibility at all as they come around the Elm Hill curve. By the time they get

to the road near our fence, Elm Hill has essentially straightened out along its new east -west direction.

You may ask, what's wrong with building a 4-ft. fence along that side yard? Well, unfortunately, a fence of that height wouldn't be tall enough for our furry friend Gus. Here's how we know: some friends of ours purchased one of these above-ground pools and invited us to swim over at their house earlier this summer.



We were all surprised at one point, while the kids were having fun in the pool and Gus was playing in their backyard, to hear a terrific splash and astonished gasps from the kids. That's right: Gus had cleared the 4-ft wall of the pool in a single bound and was now happily doggie-paddling along with his little friends. (He's a very athletic Labrador and we are considering entering him in the Dog Olympics.)

So, a 4-ft. wall along our side yard just isn't high enough to keep him contained. Plus, it wouldn't provide too much privacy for our backyard, as the average pedestrian could still walk by and look right over.

So, for all these reasons, we'd like to request permission to go with our original plan and build a 6-ft. fence.

You will make life a lot more enjoyable not only for Gus, but also for our children, as I'm sure they would be very happy if they won't always have to put a leash on Gus every time they bring him outside to play. Here they are:

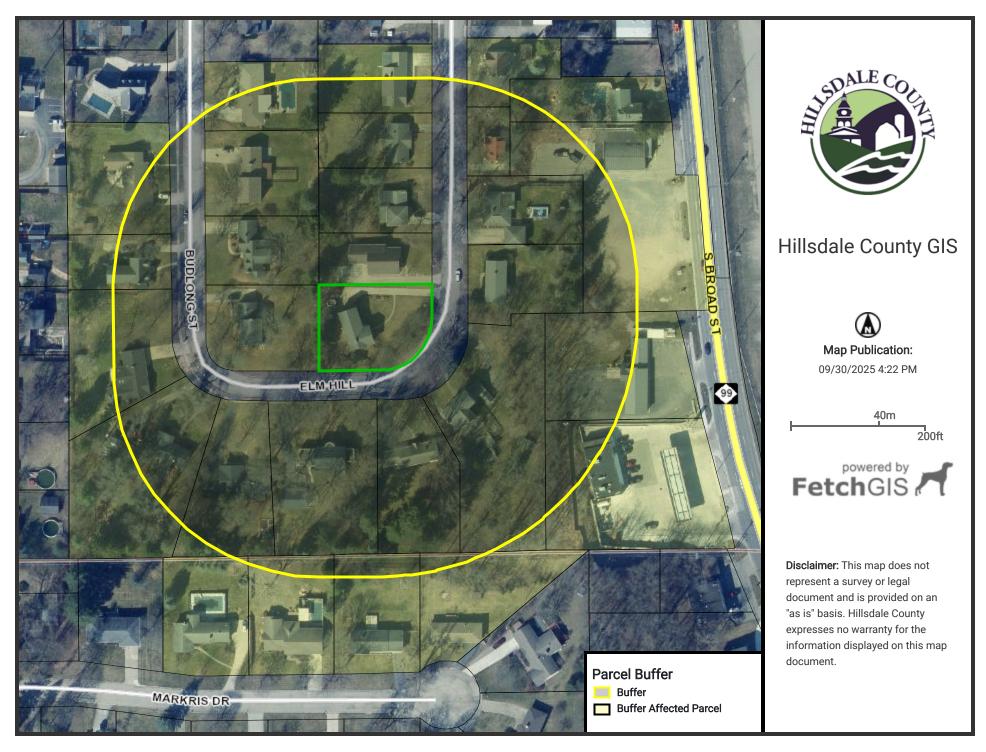

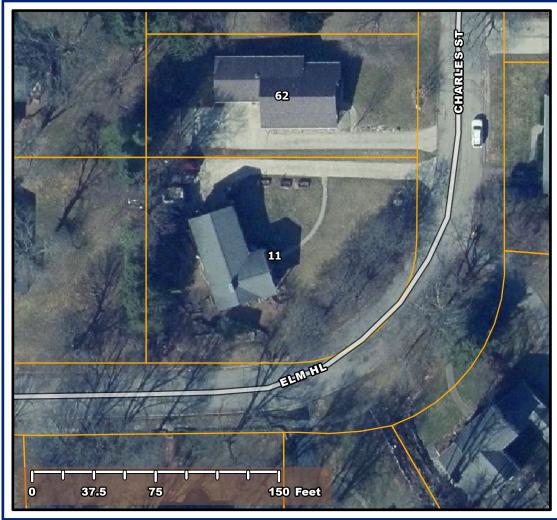

Staff Report VV2025-0001

Description

On September 3, 2025, Watkins Fence, submitted a preliminary fence permit application on behalf of Timothy Green, owner of 11 Elm Hill. The project proposed a new six (6) foot high privacy fence within, what was assumed to be, the side and rear yard of the property. The plans were reviewed and it was determined that the proposed location of the fence, based on addressing, were located within the front and side yard of the property. The Zoning Administrator notified the applicant and property owner that if the plans were submitted without meeting the ordinance required limits, the plan would be denied.

On September 15, 2025, the applicant was officially submitted. Fence Permit PF2025-027 was denied due to the proposed fence not meeting the definition of a non-privacy fence and exceeding the maximum height for a fence located in the front yard. Notice of denial was mailed that same day to both to Mr. Green and Watkins Fence.

On September 30, 2025, Mr. Green submitted a petition to the Zoning Board of Appeals appealing the denial by the Zoning Administrator. The appeal request, VV2025-0001, was opened that same day. The Zoning Board of Appeals set a public hearing for October 29, 2025 after a quorum was verified with members.

The appeal requests that the owner be allowed to build the fence as proposed by the original application submitted by Watkins Fence. They do not believe that the portion of the property proposed for the project should be considered their front yard.

Relevant Zoning Ordinance

Sec.36-6. – Definitions.

Lot, corner, means a lot where the interior angle of two adjacent sides at the intersection of two streets is less than 135 degrees. A lot abutting upon a curved street or streets shall be considered a corner lot, for the purposes of this chapter, if the arc is of less radius than 150 feet and the tangents to the curve, at the two points where the lot lines meet the curve or the straight street line extended, form an interior angle or less than 135 degrees.

Fence or wall, obscuring, means a structure of definite height and location to serve as an obscuring screen in carrying out the requirements of this chapter.

Yards means the open spaces on the same lot with a main building unoccupied and unobstructed from the ground upward, except as otherwise provided in this chapter, and as defined in this section:

- (1) Front yard means an open space extending the full width of the lot, the depth of which is the minimum horizontal distance between the front lot line and the nearest line of the main building.
- (2) Rear yard means an open space extending the full width of the lot, the depth of which is the minimum horizontal distance between the rear lot line and the nearest line of the main building.
- (3) Side yard means an open space between a main building and the side lot line, extending from the front yard to the rear yard, the width of which is the horizontal distance from the nearest point of the side lot line to the nearest point of the main building.

 - b. All fences or walls must be ornamental in nature and should be made of wrought iron, treated or rot resistant wood, brick, stone and similar replications of these materials. However, when abutting residentially zoned and/or used property, and when used to screen parking or outdoor storage areas, the fence must be constructed of an opaque weatherproof material, woven chain link fencing is not permitted.
 - c. Fences and walls located in the required and non-addressed (secondary) front yard of a corner or double frontage lot must be setback from the property line as follows, unless otherwise approved by the zoning administrator (or designee):
 - 1. No less than one foot for ornamental fences and walls meeting the definition of a non-privacy fence and not intended to restrain animals of any kind up to four feet in height;
 - 2. No less than four feet for fences and walls up to four feet in height.
 - 3. No less than six feet for fences and walls up to six feet in height.
 - d. Fences and walls located in the side and rear yards may have a maximum height of six feet, unless otherwise approved by the zoning administrator (or designee), and may be located on the property line assuming the front yard fencing requirements are satisfied.

- e. Residents are encouraged to utilize ornamental materials, including but not limited to materials such as wrought iron, brick, stone, treated wood and similar replications of these materials, such as vinyl fencing that has the appearance of one of these materials.
- f. Chain link or similar fencing is permitted everywhere except within the front yard.
- g. The finished side of a fence or wall must face outward toward any adjacent property or right-of-way.
- h. No fences or walls are permitted within the required site clearance triangles. The same site clearance triangle applies to solid fences abutting detached garages located on the non-addressed frontage of a corner lot, visibility at intersections.

Variance: The applicant is requesting a variance to increase the maximum height to 6' and allow a privacy fence within the addressed front yard of parcel 30-006-435-102-23 known as 11 Elm Hill.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff ask that the Zoning Board of Appeal recommend an ordinance amendment to the Planning Commission to add a definition for a "non-privacy fence," as it is not currently found within the ordinance.

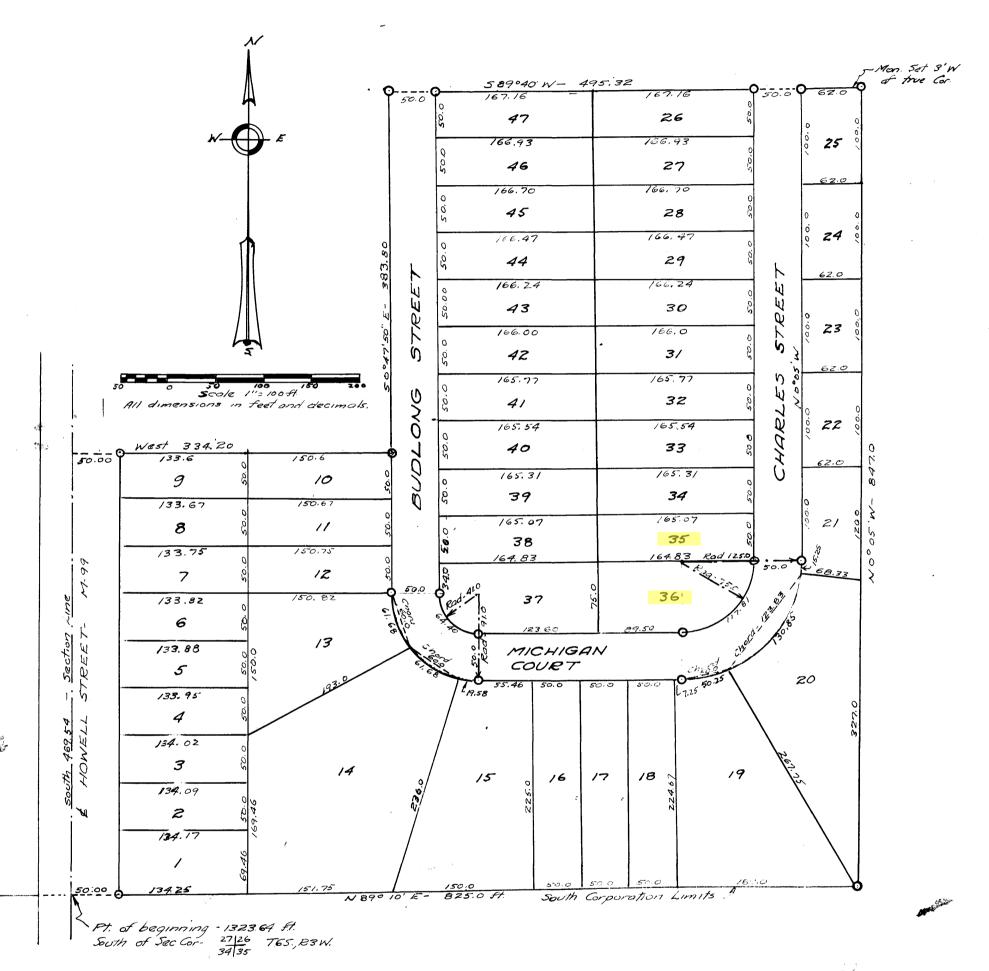
