Dawn Theater Stencil Restoration

Hi Ron,

After reviewing the project in detail, we propose 2 options for you to consider for recreating the original stencil designs and color palate for the Dawn Theater. The scope and budget are our initial ideas, we are certainly open to input and feedback from those involved in this project.

Option 1:

InPlainSight ART becomes the subcontractor for entire stencil restoration project with a budget of \$ 95,000.00.

Working closely with W. Gary Anderson Architects, we will begin with their vector graphic depiction of the stencil patterns, scale and location documentation to recreate high-resolution vector graphic line art of each of the individual stencil patterns to the correct scale. We will verify and confirm the color palate with the Interior Designer. After all artwork is verified and confirmed we will produce .7mm laser cut mylar stencils.

InPlainSight ART will interview and hire an artisan/painter to complete the stenciling on-site. This subcontractor will be responsible for staging and the stencil painting. Via site visits and on-line meetings, we will work closely together to ensure that the stencils are working as designed, have clean lines and proper registration.

Reviewing the images of the original artwork, there appears to be evidence of multiple techniques. We will develop strategies with our artisan/painter subcontractor to best recreate the original stencil painting. For example, we believe that color grounds were painted first, mono chromatic color stenciling was painted over the ground and then hand painted accents in a third color were painted over the stencil work to complete an area.

We will develop a timeline, coordinate all and ensure a successful stencil restoration. We would coordinate with all involved to create the best possible outcome for this project.

Option 2:

InPlainSight ART will recreate high-resolution vector graphic line art of each of the individual stencil patterns to the correct scale and provide the stencils. We will provide a budget proposal for this service for your approval if this is the direction that you would like to pursue. There is a good amount of work needed to ascertain a square foot amount and/or a decent calculation of the number of and sizes before we can give an accurate quote on the stencil reproduction.

Working closely with W. Gary Anderson Architects, we will begin with their vector graphic depiction of the stencil patterns, scale and location documentation to recreate high-resolution vector graphic line art of each of the individual stencil patterns to the correct scale.

After all artwork is verified and confirmed we will produce .7mm laser cut mylar stencils for the project and ship to you.

AMY BAUR is the co-creator of In Plain Sight Art Studios, based in Minneapolis. Since 2004, she has developed a variety of approaches for translating and assembling the many voices articulated in a successful Public work of art. Integrating digital media with traditional studio art practices, utilizing the electronic tablet, photographing objects, landscape and light- her expertise is collaging these sometimes desperate parts into a unified whole. Baur exhibits her own work nationally. She holds a BFA in photography from the University of Alaska and an MFA in photography from the University of Illinois.

Her expertise is 2D based collage and design. Listening to the shape and intention of a site, building visual resonance for a multi-layered context is a great strength of Amy's.





BRIAN BOLDON exhibits his sculpture nationally and internationally as a solo artist and as collaborator with artist Amy Baur creating Public Art installations. Boldon uses digital technology for printing glass and ceramic enamels, 3D printing of carbon fiber and porcelain. Boldon coordinated the Ceramics and Graduate Programs at Michigan State University from 1995-2008, headed the Ceramics Program at the University of Alaska Anchorage 1990-1995 and taught Sculpture at Hamilton College in Clinton NY 1989-90. Boldon received a BS in Art from the University of Wisconsin Madison in 1982 and a MFA from Rhode Island School of Design..

Brian greatly understands how the systems of ideas and mechanics of the material can be made physical.

Team Responsibilities

In Plain Sight Art is a collaboration of artists Amy Baur and Brian Boldon. While early on in a project both work to create the conceptual basis, design aesthetic that would best serves a desired result, each have different strengths. For the past 16 years have created, designed and fabricated over 50 large-scale Public works of art. Amy primarily gathers the source material and designs the artwork, scales the artwork up to site specs and prints the ceramic digital glaze images for fusing the imagery to the substrate. Brian's specialization, MFA Ceramic/Sculpture, primarily fabricates the artwork and conceptualizes the structural elements. He is constantly pushing the envelop in terms of experimentation. He transfers the ceramic glaze decals on to tiles or glass panels & kiln fires them. Both can oversee installation.

Our bid is for the stenciling as specified in the Gary Anderson Architects site drawings 2/22/2021, 4/20/21

Price for executing the stencil work is \$49,000.00. A 20% deposit is required for start-up, and the balance is due upon completion.

This includes, all labor, materials, scaffolding, housing and travel costs. It is solely for the stenciling and does not include any prep or base painting of the surface to be stenciled. It also does not include the color bands on the top and bottom of the walls. We estimate that it will take approximately 35 working days to complete. All areas to be stenciled should have the final base finish prior to our arrival. The bid also does not include floor protection or additional scaffolding costs if the chandeliers in the main theatre are installed.

If our bid is accepted, the price also includes creating one sample of each different stencil to be approved prior to starting the stenciling.
